YesterYear by Walt Dixon

It seems like just yesterday that things were so much different than they are now. For instance, we can get the latest news of the day 24/7 just by pressing a button or turning a knob. In the old days we got 98% of our news from the newspaper. Oh there were a few radio stations broadcasting the news maybe five to fifteen minuets once in awhile, but our biggest source was the newspaper.

There were news stands in front of stores and there would be a stack of papers there with no one around. You would pick up a paper and leave the right amount of change on top of the rest. No one even thought of taking a paper and not leaving the money. Later on in the day the news man would come by and pick up the money and put down more papers. If there was a breaking story, the news paper boy would gather up the extra editions and stand on the corner or walk around the neighborhood shouting "EXTRA EXTRA, READ ALL ABOUT IT" just to get you to buy his papers.

Another thing different today is the laundry. In those days laundry was usually done on Monday. Instead of turning a knob to set the temperature and the time you would adjust the hot and cold water to the right temperature. There was no walking away and letting the machine do everything for you, oh no. After the right amount of time you would stop the machine, swing the wringer out between the two tubs that was filled with cool or cold water, run the soapy clothes into one of the tubs, and then back to the other tub until all of the soap was out of the clothes. There was no such thing as putting them in the dryer, for there were no dryers. You would put them through the wringer again to get out most of the water, put them in a basket, and take them outside and hang them on the clothes line in the back yard and let the sun dry them. After drying you would take them in the house and iron them. Different huh?

In the old days some theaters would have what they called bank night or

dish night. You would register once and your name went into a hopper and then on certain nights the manager would stop the show and draw a name out of the hopper. The prize could be anywhere from \$20.00 to \$100.00 but mostly the prize was dishes or a coupon to a local market for food. Speaking of markets, there was one in town (Forrest Market) that had an offer; if you bought ten dollars worth of groceries and kept the receipts they would give you a dollar's worth of food which would fill 3 or 4 large bags. Remember, bread sold for ten cents then.

Remember soap box derbies when kids would build a racer out of an apple box and old 2 x 4s? We would take our great machines to the top of 131st (Carolina) or 135th (New York) and coast down hoping we could get them stopped or turned before we ended up in the middle of Hawthorne Boulevard. Man, what fun that was.

Remember those were THE GOOD DAYS...til next time. WALT

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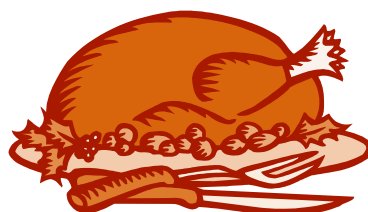
